LUDMILA My name is Ludmila, I'm 49 years old. I'm still married. I'm about to get divorced

from my husband.

It wasn't exactly a dating app, I got a text on Messenger saying that someone would like to chat with me. At first I didn't really react. I just wrote that it was a

bad time, I was at work or watching a movie with my husband, things like that... But the man was very persistent. He kept trying to send me messages for two weeks, so one day I replied.

He asked me how many children I have, how long I've been married. And when I asked him why he just said he wanted to get to know me better.

TEGA Didn't you find it strange that an unknown man was trying to contact you?

LUDMILA I didn't really think about it at the time.

TEGA (studio) The mystery man from the internet kept praising Ludmila, even though they did

not know each other at all.

TEGA How did you feel?

LUDMILA Like a woman after 33 years in a relationship. Nice, right? You don't realise you

don't hear things like those at home and then you think: no one's told me that for a long time. I've been called Mum by everyone my whole marriage. And now he gave me a nickname – Sunshine – and then he started calling me Ludi, short for Ludmila. And when you don't hear that this whole time, you think: Wow, I actually

have a name.

KAPR I am Lieutenant Colonel Ondřej Kapr and I work for the Police of the Czech

Republic in the office of the Criminal Police and Investigation Service, which is a unit that deals with coordination, methodology and preventive activities in the

field of criminal proceedings.

LUDMILA Sometimes you even get goosebumps or tears in your eyes, because you think:

wow, a stranger talks to me this nicely and my husband doesn't even bother, you

know?

KAPR In general, the public probably thinks that anyone who gets lured into this kind of

scam is just stupid, but we know that is not true. It is just that the perpetrators

are excellent at targeting a lonely person who is emotionally parched.

TEGA You probably deleted those chats, didn't you?

LUDMILA I was just thinking I could try to look if I still have them archived...

Light of my life, you're one of a kind, one of the best women in the world, I can't imagine my life without you because you mean so much to me, you are the air I breathe, the water I drink, the food I eat, the lady of my dreams, my queen, the

best of the best, I'll always love you, honey.

TEGA (studio) The man introduced himself to Ludmila as an officer in the US army Michael

Moore.

**LUDMILA** 

You could tell that he was writing through a online translator, but he wrote in Czech. I replied in English through a translator and when he started writing in Czech, I wrote in Czech too. It was obvious he couldn't speak Czech, you know.

#### MUSIC Cyclic Dream (underlines text)

**KAPR** 

The Czech Republic was for a long time protected by the language barrier from these love based scams, they are not only a Czech problem, but a worldwide trend. The perpetrators are usually English speakers and that is why they use the written form of communication, simply because they can use online translators. Of course, if he would call you and you did not speak English, he could not scam you because you would not know what he wants from you, you do not know where to send money.

**LUDMILA** 

I couldn't wait until it was finally 10 PM and we could chat. Yeah, for me even that one hour in the evening meant... Sometimes, he would make an exception and he had time until 1 or half past 1 in the morning... He usually ended the chat at 11, because he said he had to turn the monitors on, to guard the camp.

TEGA

And did you ever want to call him?

**LUDMILA** 

Well, he would always say something like: I'll risk it for you, I'll call you. But he knew that if he'd say that, I'd say: No, it's not worth you taking a risk and calling me. I didn't feel the need to call him.

**TEGA (studio)** 

Michael claimed he was currently stationed in Aden, a city in Yemen. But Ludmila is an inquisitive woman and she found out that at that time there was no ongoing fighting in Aden. Michael however stood by the claim that he and his unit were there for "peacekeeping missions". Yet, even those seemed to be unbearable for him.

**LUDMILA** 

He begged me to help him get out of the war. He said he'd come and we'd live together. He told me to find a place where we could buy or build a house. I haven't mentioned this yet, but he had a fourteen year old son Perry. I was supposed to be a mother to his son. And somewhere in that chat he swore on his life that I'm the greatest love of his life and that he's never done this before.

**KAPR** 

A common tactic the perpetrators use is a child. A man, the American soldier, starts writing to some woman and then all of a sudden a child appears. And the child immediately starts calling the woman Mommy. The woman might not be able to imagine that it might be just one person behind it and again some feelings arise. And the child, too, is trying to get money off of their so called mommy. They want money for some treatment, some school expenses, birthdays, they can even lure out some gifts they want delivered directly to some place in Africa.

**LUDMILA** 

We wrote and chatted for about a week or two and he told me about where he was stationed and I'm meticulous like that, so I wanted to find out more about it, so I started to search for information about the American army. But I found many articles like: Woman scammed by such and such, right? And I read the article but was more interested in the comments below. And a young girl wrote that it shouldn't be hard to put the person through Google lens and find them.

TEGA (studio)

Mrs Ludmila put Michael Moore's photo through the search and she found out that the person in the photo is actually Colonel Bryan Denny. Just in the year 2019, his photographs were used for more than three thousand love scams. The number might have doubled since then.

**LUDMILA** 

And so I thought, that person must be on Facebook. So I found the real Colonel and I wrote to him, I sent him the pictures I got from the scammer. He only replied this: Who scammed you with my photos?

**TEGA** 

What did you feel when you found out that this many women had been "in love" with the same man?

LUDMILA

I don't actually know, I didn't really let it get to me. Like, I knew he'd promised marriage to many women.

TEGA

And it wasn't even him.

**LUDMILA** 

Exactly, I was just going to say. It wasn't him and it probably wasn't the same person who wrote to me.

**KAPR** 

Perpetrators often use some fictional identity – they download a picture of some interesting person, an interesting man or woman from the internet, and they impersonate them. It is often various company directors or influencers. It is those American soldiers, oil rig workers. A sign of such a scam is when the perpetrator is trying not to communicate with you through video calls. That is, they will communicate either through chat, which is the easiest option because of an online translator, or even communicate through a call, but only in a way so you cannot see their true identity. Do not trust videos they send you. They can take a photo of some famous person and the system can move the mouth in such a way that you might not be able to tell that it is actually not that person talking. That it is a scam.

**LUDMILA** 

My husband knew I was chatting with him and I said: See? I had some suspicions because I somehow always felt there was something wrong. And I said: Well, now it's my turn to play. I'll get back to him now, I said.

**LUDMILA** 

It was the 17 April and on the 25 April my husband and I had our anniversary. Thirtieth or thirty first. And my husband instead of coming home was celebrating somewhere else. And the scammer felt that I was writing differently, not very interested in chatting, nervous and he started to ask what was wrong. And I blabbed about

everything, of course. And he started telling me: A man must not treat a woman like that, especially a precious flower like you, right? And I, angry as I was, sad, started chatting with him. And at that moment he felt that I took the bait. So, I wanted to pull his leg and it turned out in a completely opposite way. He got me.

LUDMILA

We got intimate, we wrote about sex, what we like, we sent a few photos. Not of the face, obviously. I asked about that and he said that they couldn't do that because of security, right? And it really got that far that I hadn't had sex like that in a long time. Even though it was just virtual, it was something new. I'd only been with my husband since I was 16, so this was something completely different.

LUDMILA

Some time later he didn't write for a whole day and I had my head turned so much that I was nervous, what if something happened. That night I had a bad dream about some military operation. My brain just started working on its own, subconsciously. And he didn't write. I was hanging on by a thread, I just wanted to cry. And that's when he wrote. He said they were sent on a mission and his group was attacked by rebels, 4 of his men were killed and one was badly wounded. He even sent me a photo of him in a helicopter, right, how they were bandaging him. He said he has to be at the wounded soldier's side all day, that he can't leave him, he's like family, he doesn't really have anyone else and things like that.

He kept saying he had wounded soldiers, that they died and now the commanders said that officers have to replace the dead soldiers on the front lines. The first thing that came out of me was: No, that's not possible, they can't! And he said: Well, there is another option. And I said: What? That he could retire. That he could retire early, but he would have to buy himself out. And I knew I didn't have any money and that would be a problem. And he said that it has to go through the UN and we just have to buy him out of the army.

So, that's how he started asking for money.

LUDMILA When I told him I didn't have any money, he stopped communicating.

**TEGA (studio)** 

It has been proven that people responsible for a large part of these cases are from west Africa. That is why scams like these are called Nigerian scams. They are nothing new, however, they originated in the 16th century, when a so-called "spanish prisoner" asked for financial help. He would write from prison about his treasure which he hid "somewhere out there" and would promise to share it, if the addressee would help him. Hundreds of years ago the perpetrators wrote and sent letters by hand. In our modern time of the internet, it is possible

to reach thousands of people at once with only a few clicks. Modern Nigerian letter writers additionally focus on the romance part of the whole story – they wait until the victim falls in love with them and then they strike.

### **MUSIC Forest (fades out)**

LUDMILA

I think I was most addicted to those words that I needed to hear. I wasn't deterred, I kept writing to him and he didn't reply. You know what it does to you when you're in love and they don't respond.

My husband caught me once crying like crazy. He was looking at me and saying: You're not normal, are you? You could see it in his eyes. Then, another time, he asked me: If he showed up today, would you leave with him? And I was really in love, I don't know how I could've fallen in love with someone I've never seen. Just those words. So I told him, yes, I would leave.

And then he asked: And what if he was black, you wouldn't mind? I said: No, I wouldn't. At that point, I didn't care what he looked like.

**KAPR** 

Love has a reason for existing, it is about driving us to find partners, to birth children, I am sure there is a rational reason. Because it is such a strong emotion and it can control us. Who has felt it knows, we all know that under the influence of love we are able to do anything. If people are capable of committing suicide, then they are capable of other extremes such as sending millions to somewhere in Africa. It is an incredibly strong emotion and everyone should stop and think if they ever did something stupid under the influence of love and infatuation.

**LUDMILA** 

And then we needed to consolidate our loans so I just covered the information he could use and I let him see that our loan was approved and that I had the 50 000 he needed. And the moment I sent it to him he did a 180 turn and started praising and flattering me again. We started chatting again and so I let him think that I was going to send the money. He wrote that it was just a misunderstanding between us and everything would be okay now, we'd be together soon and so on. I didn't believe we would ever be together, I just wanted him to write to me. I just wanted to hear those nice words.

**LUDMILA** 

I want us to enjoy a life together. Sunshine, when I come to you I don't ever want you to be sad and think about suicide. I don't ever want that, all right? Because, when he dumped me, I really did think about those things, you know... It hit me hard.

TEGA (studio) Even though Ludmila claimed the money was on the way, it was not.

**LUDMILA** 

So he let me pull his leg for a while. After two weeks I asked a friend who works at the post office to write me a receipt as if I had sent the money. If it was found out, it was actually a fraud. But as I said, there was no stamp or anything on it.

At that point, Ludmila and Michael were trying to scam each other. Though they had different motivations. Michael even sent a simple form to fill out to Ludmila. It was a request for retirement, the text of which is:

I request an urgent retirement leave from the military for my fiancé Michael Moore and I ask him to come home, because he has left home too long. We need him back home to take care of our family. We and our children miss him very much, we are afraid for him. I am so tired of trying to sleep, when my fiancé is leaving for a dangerous mission.

Ludmila was supposed to put her personal information, including her address, date of birth and phone number on the form.

LUDMILA And all I did was copy and send it through email to the UN.

TEGA How do you send an email to the UN?

LUDMILA They just give you an email address and then the UN replies that the request has

been accepted, all the formalities are "sorted" and now I just have to wait to find out where to send the money. Of course, it was a scam. Have you ever seen the

UN write to someone they don't know?

LUDMILA Like this: Honey, I have to go, okay? I'll write tonight and let me know when the

UN replies, okay? I love you.

TEGA Did you say I love you to each other?

LUDMILA Yes. Yes, we did.

TEGA How did it feel the first time?

LUDMILA It was strange, at that moment I thought: You have a husband and now you're

saying I love you to someone else. I think at that time I was getting what was

going on a little, that it's just... but I was in love, you know.

KAPR We see dozens of these cases a year. Sometimes the damage is in the

thousands, sometimes hundreds of thousands, but there are even millions of crowns. Often in these cases the millions are not even from the victim's money, but they "borrow" it somewhere, like their workplace. But in the end they embezzle it and then we have to prosecute these people for embezzlement.

LUDMILA Then he found out I wasn't going to send him money so he started to write

messages, that I'm an evil person, that I had been just playing with him the whole time. I couldn't help myself, so I wrote this sort of confession to him. Well, he wasn't responding to that and then he just wrote: You are the destroyer

of life and the killer of dreams, your life is full of deceit and suffering. I regret the day I met you. I hate you with my life.

That hurt me a lot because he was the scammer, he was deceiving and scamming me this whole time. But when I used the same method but only because I was really in love, he said that my feelings are fake, that I'm lying and all that... I didn't want to send him money that belongs to my children, to my family, there's nothing wrong with that.

LUDMILA I fell apart. I needed to find a substitute so I wrote to, well, I just searched for those scammers in my messenger. But it didn't give me the same thing as with Michael.

TEGA (studio) Ludmila also found out that Colonel Bryan Denny, whose photos the scammer used as bait, founded a charity organisation in America, helping women who fell victim

to romantic scams. From Bryan's colleague Ludmila learned that:

LUDMILA The FBI is investigating exactly these scams with Bryan's profile. So I sent them the

accounts he gave me and she said that I have to fill a form and send it directly to the

FBI.

TEGA But it wasn't a scam this time, was it?

LUDMILA No, this was real.

LUDMILA When I sent it to the FBI I got a threat on my WhatsApp. Let me try this...

TEGA (studio) The recordings Ludmila received are curses in the language of the Yoruba tribe

in Africa.

LUDMILA Well, sometimes I had a strange feeling but I'm not afraid of them finding me

TEGA (studio) Chatting with Michael changed Ludmila's life. Now she is going through

divorce proceedings and she underwent a visual and mental transformation.

LUDMILA Sometimes I think I shouldn't have written to anyone, but no, I don't. It was a

to look like anything.
